

Are there restrictions as to the number of guests I may bring to the Club?
For dining and social events, there is no limit. For details pertaining to golf and tennis, please see the Club's Membership Rules and Regulations.

What is the dress code at Willow Fork?
Dress in the clubhouse is casual with the exception of the Formal Dining Room on special occasions where jackets (without tie) are required. Appropriate golf, tennis and athletic attire apply when recreating at the Club. Blue jeans, cut-offs and tank tops on the golf course are not acceptable. Am I allowed to own my own golf cart?
Although Willow Fork cannot provide storage for private carts, privately-owned carts may be used on the golf course with the permission of Club Management. No trailering of carts is allowed either. Please consult the Head Golf Professional pertaining to current regulations, restrictions and applicable trail fees.

If I relocate to another city, are there advantages to joining another Arnold Palmer private Club?
Yes. The Club-to-Club Transfer program is designed to assist you, should you be relocated to a city where another Arnold Palmer Country Club is located. Some restrictions apply; please consult our Membership Director for complete details.

As a Member of Willow Fork, do I have privileges at any other golf courses or city clubs?
Members have the opportunity to receive privileges at other private, public, and resort courses operated by APGM across the U.S. Some restrictions apply to private clubs. Please consult our Membership Director for details.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

This document was created to answer the most commonly asked questions by Members and prospective members alike. Willow Fork will be operated in accordance with these guidelines as stated in our Membership Rules and Regulations. Terms and conditions may change from time-to-time as provided by the rules.

Who owns and operates Willow Fork Country Club?
Willow Fork is owned by Arnold Palmer Golf Management. The Palmer Group brings to Willow Fork unparalleled expertise in providing the highest quality experience for members. They are dedicated to delivering the ultimate in member satisfaction through quality maintenance practices, quality service levels, terrific member events, and activities. Their primary focus is members — meeting their needs and exceeding their expectations — and they are committed to accomplishing this through a partnership, whereby the members work together with APGM to allow Willow Fork to reach its full potential. APGM owns and operates numerous properties throughout the country.

Is it a prerequisite to live in one of the developments surrounding the golf course in order to join the Club?
No. Membership is not restricted to those living in the surrounding development.

How many golfing members does Willow Fork intend to accept?
To ensure a high level of service and the finest in programs and amenities, membership in Willow Fork is limited. When our proposed cap for Full Privilege Golf Memberships reaches 525, a waiting list for those wishing to join the club will be established. Currently, no membership caps have officially been established for our social and tennis membership categories.

What do my monthly dues cover?
Monthly dues pay for the club's day-to-day costs of doing business, i.e., maintenance of the golf course, clubhouse, tennis courts, fitness center and pool. Additionally, monthly dues pay the salaries of our employees, purchase of supplies and merchandise, utilities, along with other routine expenses involved in operating a business.

When do my dues commence after I have joined?
Dues are prorated from the day your membership is approved. You may pay for your prorated dues at the time your membership application is accepted, or you may elect to have them included in your first monthly billing statement.

Will I be responsible for annual assessments?
No. Unlike many "member-owned" private clubs, no members are subject to unpredictable and costly assessments. Capital improvements and any operating losses are the responsibility of Willow Fork.

Is my entire family able to use the Club?
Yes. Memberships at Willow Fork include privileges for the Primary Member and his or her immediate family. Some restrictions and guest fees may apply. Please see the Club's Membership Rules and Regulations for further details.

Do Social or Tennis Members have any golfing privileges at the club?
Currently, no Members other than golf members shall have access to tee times, unless the individual is a guest of a golf member, has been approved by the Head Golf Professional, and has paid applicable guest fees. Social and Tennis Members may only play golf as a guest of a golf member who is in good standing. Please see the Club's Membership Rules and Regulations for further details.
